Network/Computer Systems Administrator | Average Pay: \$32- 48/hour

Description: Install, configure, and support an organization's local area network (LAN), wide area network (WAN), and Internet systems. Monitor network to ensure network availability to all system users and perform necessary maintenance to support network availability.

Software Developer | Average Pay: \$41-62/hour

Description: Research, design, develop, and test operating systems-level software, compilers, and network distribution software for medical, industrial, military, communications, aerospace, business, scientific, and general computing applications.
